

H. 3581 - Local Government Fund (LGF) -Vote to give counties flexibility in funding state mandated services

Amendment No. 1

Senator ROSE proposed the following Amendment No. 1:

Amend the joint resolution as and if amended, by adding an appropriately numbered new SECTION to read:

/ SECTION ____ . For fiscal year 2009-2010, if the actual amount appropriated to the Local Government Fund is less than the amount appropriated for fiscal year 2008-2009, a political subdivision receiving aid from the fund may reduce its support to any state mandated program or requirement by up to a percentage equal to the percentage reduction in the actual amount appropriated to the Local Government Fund. /
