

Current as of Feb. 4, 2026




911 Program Updates

- Procurement status and implementation timeline for the new ESInet contract
 - Request for proposals is currently in process
 - Target date for a new contract is August 2026
 - Implementation timeline is contingent upon the contract award
- GIS enhancements with the ESInet
 - PSAPs will receive statewide GIS data
 - PSAP jurisdiction boundaries, centerlines, address points
 - Supports mapping beyond local jurisdiction when calls are rerouted

- Once the research and field work is completed for a boundary clarification project, program staff will meet with officials from affected counties to discuss project details

GIS PROGRAM UPDATES





South Carolina Geographic Information Council (SCGIC)

- Comprised of 16 members including state agencies and non-governmental organizations
 - RFA serves as the host agency for the State GIS Coordinator
- State GIS Coordinator supports the GIC by providing:
 - Statewide data aggregation
 - Information regarding legislation and policies
 - Centralized source of information
 - Statewide aerial imagery
 - State representation for nationwide geospatial initiatives



South Carolina Geospatial Goals

- Strengthen communication across the state
 - Assist in job recruitment & retention
- Streamline geospatial data sharing
- Host statewide data layers via secure REST services
 - Geocoder, parcels, address points, municipalities, political districts, etc
- Create a geospatial HUB for SC data and applications
 - Centralized location that links to other state & local GIS data and websites
 - List of data shared by individual state agencies
 - Recommendations of nationwide authoritative datasets
 - All data will be owned by individual jurisdictions and shared only upon approval



Open Data Discussion

- Open data is publicly available, non-sensitive information
- Open data reduces county workload, lowers operational costs, and supports economic growth by making accurate information easier for partners, businesses, and residents to use


US Census Bureau Updates

- South Carolina is a single response state for specific data submittals
- Coordination with local jurisdictions is essential for the success of accurate Census Bureau calculations for 2030 Decennial Census

Data Submission	Timeframe	Responsible Party for Submission
Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)	Annually	Revenue & Fiscal Affairs Office
School District Review Program (SDRP)	Annually	Revenue & Fiscal Affairs Office
Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA)	Annually	Local Jurisdictions and Legislative Office
Block Boundary Suggestion Program (BBSP)	Every 10 years	Legislative Office
Redistricting Data Program (PL 94-171)	Every 10 years	Legislative Office

Aerial Imagery 2026 Update

- NV5 was selected for a five-year contract beginning in 2026
 - Flights due to occur between Jan-Mar 2026
 - Participating counties will receive imagery in late 2026
 - Flights occur during leaf-off conditions
- Other specifics include:
 - 2-foot contours
 - 6" Resolution (option to buy-up for 3")
 - Updated elevation model



County Participation:

- 34 of 46 counties contributed as of June 2025
- Individual contributions based on geographic and economic adjustments; average of \$5,000 per county annually
