

1st Step – Created a Taskforce

- SWOT Analysis Litter Focused
- Completed a Litter Index
- Litter Task Force Grant
- Found Litter Resources
- Brought partners & elected officials together from each part of the County
- Developed a leader role Laurens County Chamber of Commerce



The Customized Plan

- Find Funding THEY FOUND IT
- County & City Government Partnerships
- Created/revised Litter Law Passed same law countywide
- Started process to become an affiliate of Keep
 America Beautiful
- Found "outside" partnerships and funding



The Customized Plan that Made South Carolina History

- Hosted a Press Conference where they announced
 - County & City Governments passing the same litter law
 - Creation of a new job at the Chamber for the position of Keep Laurens County Beautiful



Laurens County Next Steps

- Hiring Process for Affiliate Director
 - Creation of an in-depth strategic plan
- Continue utilizing the Task Force Grant
 - Increase in paying officers for litter enforcement
- Enforcing litter laws
- Providing a financial commitment
 - Apply for grants through PalmettoPride
- Working together to ensure litter issues are a top priority
- Data collection & Reporting
