#### **SPEAKERS**



#### Gov. David Beasley Former Executive Director of World Food Programme

David Beasley, a former South Carolina Governor, recently served as the Executive Director of the World Food Programme (WFP). Nominated by two

Presidents' administrations of two different parties, he was appointed to that role initially in 2017 by the Secretary-General of the United Nations and served until April 2023.

Under Gov. Beasley's leadership, WFP was the largest humanitarian organization in the world assisting over 160 million people in 2022 alone and raising over \$55 billion.

In 2020, Gov. Beasley received the Nobel Peace Prize on behalf of WFP for its efforts to provide food assistance in conflict areas and to prevent food from being used as a weapon of war and conflict.

In his acceptance speech delivered in 2021 in Oslo, Gov. Beasley stated that "Working with 115 million people in 80 countries, day-in and day-out, the women and men of WFP have gained a unique perspective. We have learned that there is great richness in those who are seen, in the eyes of the world, as 'the poor.' And many of us who are considered 'rich' are actually poor in the things that matter most."

Gov. Beasley also received the John F. Kennedy Profiles in Courage Award for his stand on the Confederate flag as well as many other awards. He majored in Microbiology at Clemson University and received a Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from the University of South Carolina. He also was a fellow and taught at the Harvard University Kennedy School of Government. He is married to the former Mary Wood Payne and has four children and three grandchildren.

### The Honorable James Gore NACo President

Serving his home county, Sonoma County, in the heart of California's Wine Country for the last eight years, Supervisor James Gore has shown steadfast and innovative leadership through

an unprecedented barrage of fires, floods, droughts and more. He has become a well-known champion of resiliency by engaging and empowering residents through recovery and rebuilding in the wake of wildfires. He led efforts to secure historic regional, state, and federal funding for emergency preparedness and infrastructure investments. He is also a key local and state leader on housing, homelessness and behavioral health.

During the pandemic, Gore led the California State Association of Counties as president through the multitude of statewide prevention and response actions. Locally, he spearheaded the creation of Sonoma County's Office of Equity to take on the disparate impacts of COVID on underserved communities.

Gore began his public service life as a volunteer for the U.S. Peace Corps in Bolivia, where he helped communities build water management and agricultural systems. He resides in Healdsburg, California.



### Dr. David Godbold CEO, Wounded Warrior Program

Dr. David Godbold is the CEO of the Wounded Warrior Program, which works with a multitude of government agencies and AbilityOne/GSA companies to establish programs that provide

meaningful employment opportunities to Wounded Warriors, veterans and Americans with disabilities. Dr. Godbold has directed government operations inside and outside the contiguous United States, for various agency missions.






