Guaranteed Political Subdivision Fund Applications

South Carolina counties and municipalities who participated in opioid-related settlements must submit requests seeking funding for approved abatement strategies from their available allocation of the Guaranteed Political Subdivision Subfund.

The window for applications will be published on the website and announced during Board meetings and Coffee Chats.

Applications must include the following:
Approved Abatement Strategy
Implementation Plan
Process/outcome measure
Budget for strategy





Community Planning for Opioid Remediation and Abatement

This is an opportunity for guaranteed political subdivisions to bring together stakeholders to prioritize addressing the opioid crisis in their communities and develop a community action plan based on the approved opioid abatement strategies.

Guaranteed political subdivisions may submit a Letter of Intent (LOI), rather than an application, to develop comprehensive long-term opioid remediation plans.

This is an open-ended opportunity as there is no deadline for submission. A political subdivision may make this request once every 3 years.

GPS Funds Subject to Reallocation

According to the settlement agreement, Exhibit A, II, A. 'Any money allocated to a Political Subdivision in a given year which is unused at the end of that year will remain available to that Political Subdivision for three (3) additional years, after which the money shall be moved to the Discretionary Subfund.'
