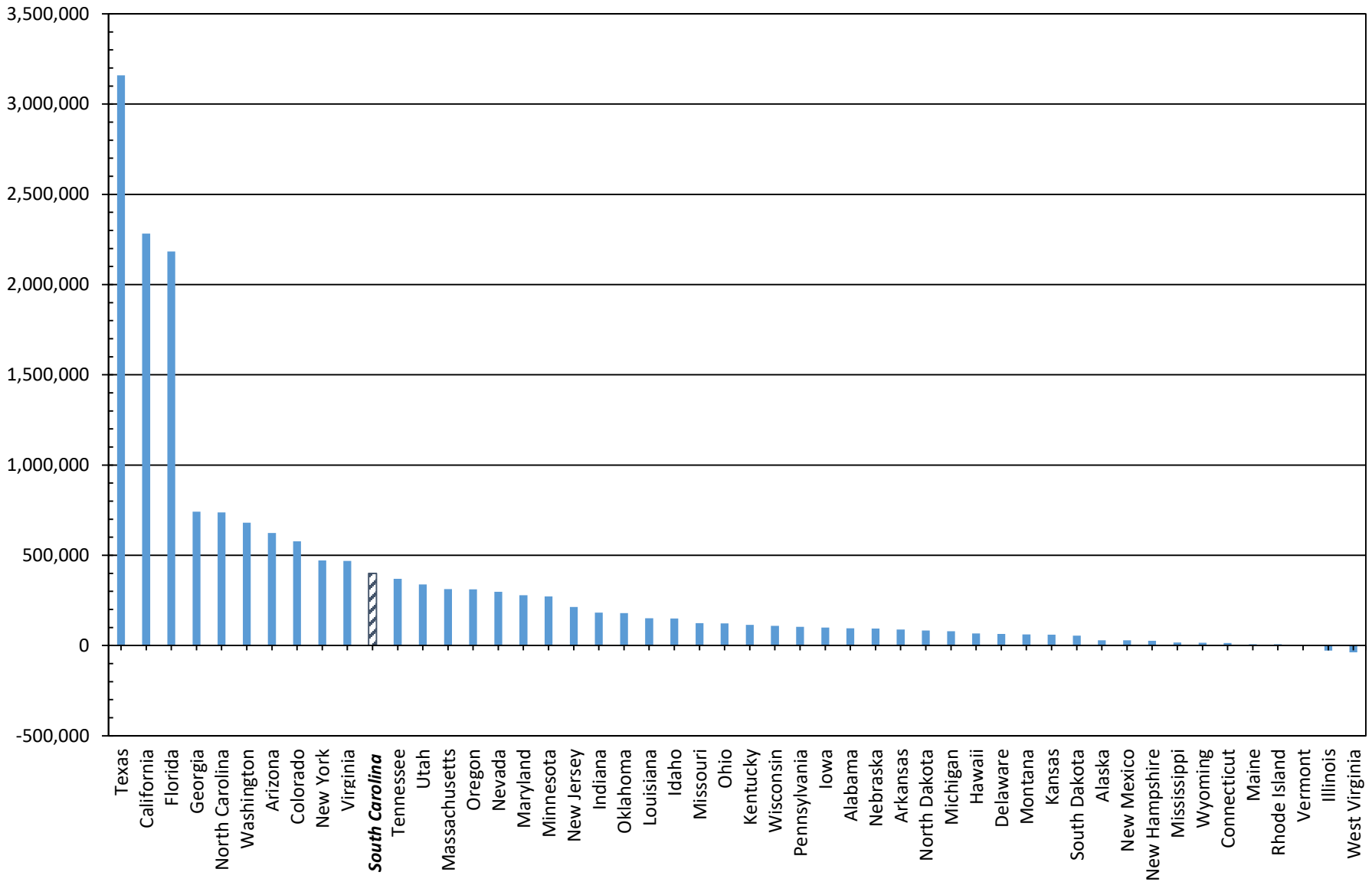

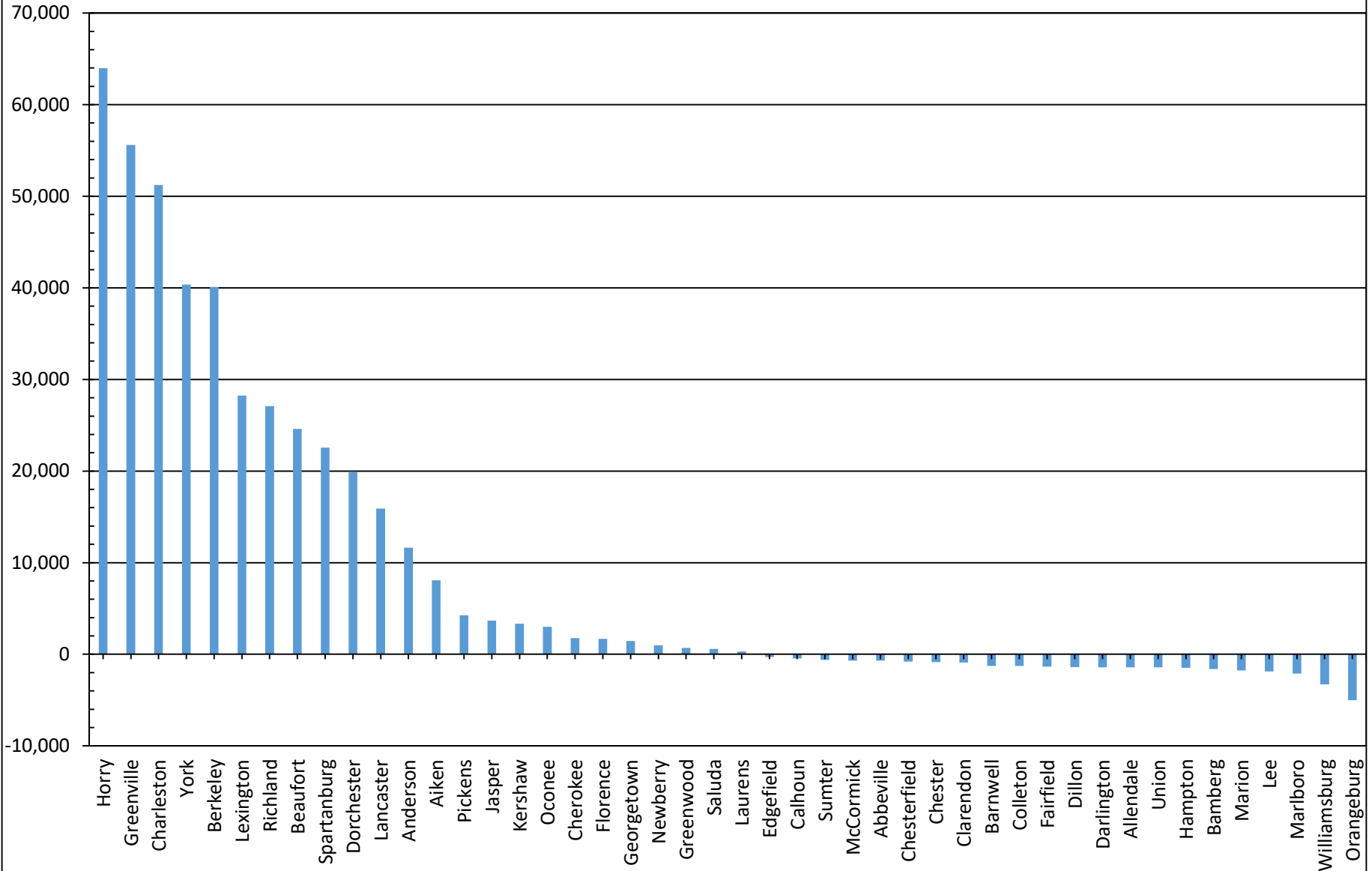


UNITED STATES CENSUS POPULATION Change From 2010 to 2017

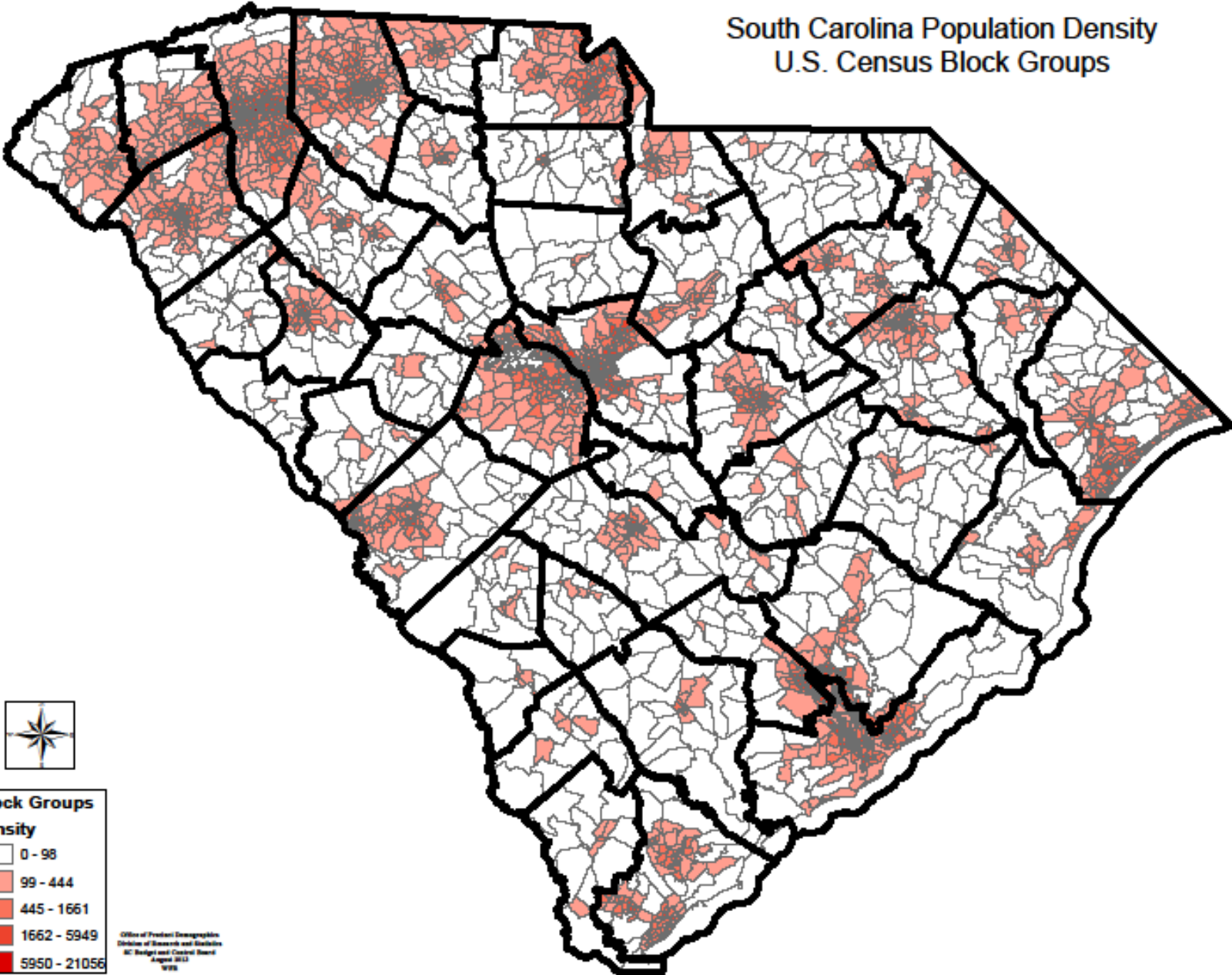


SOUTH CAROLINA CENSUS POPULATION

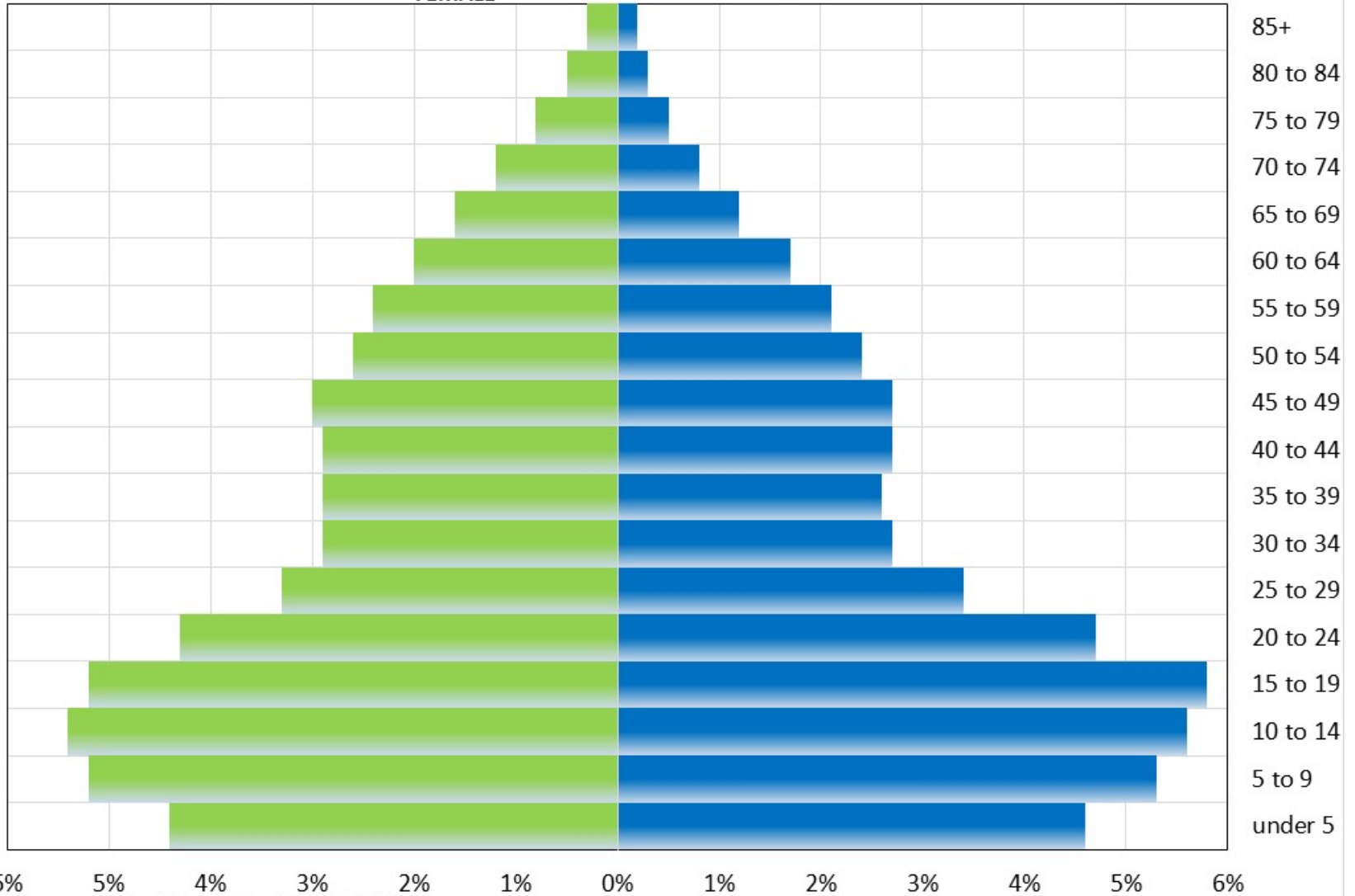

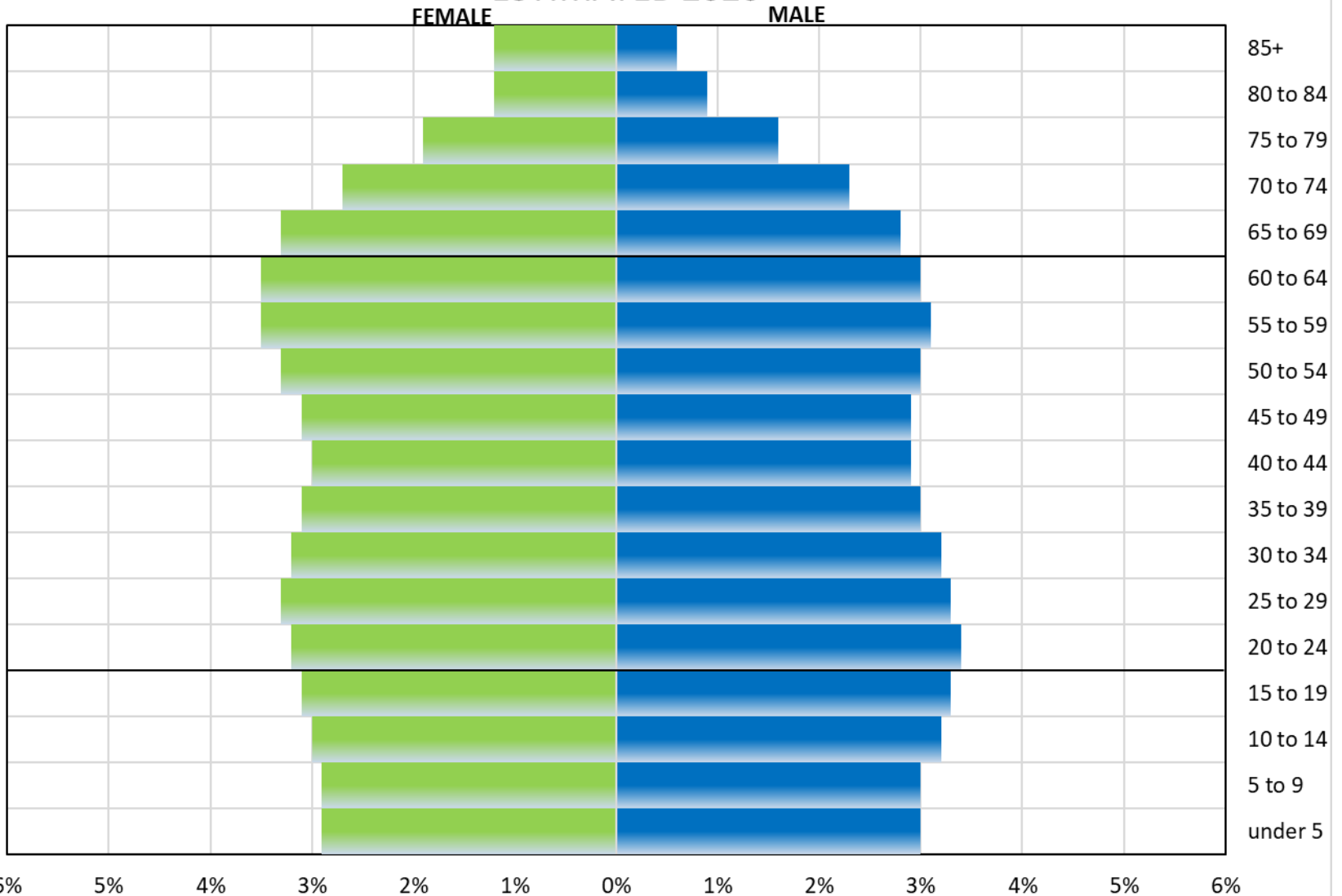

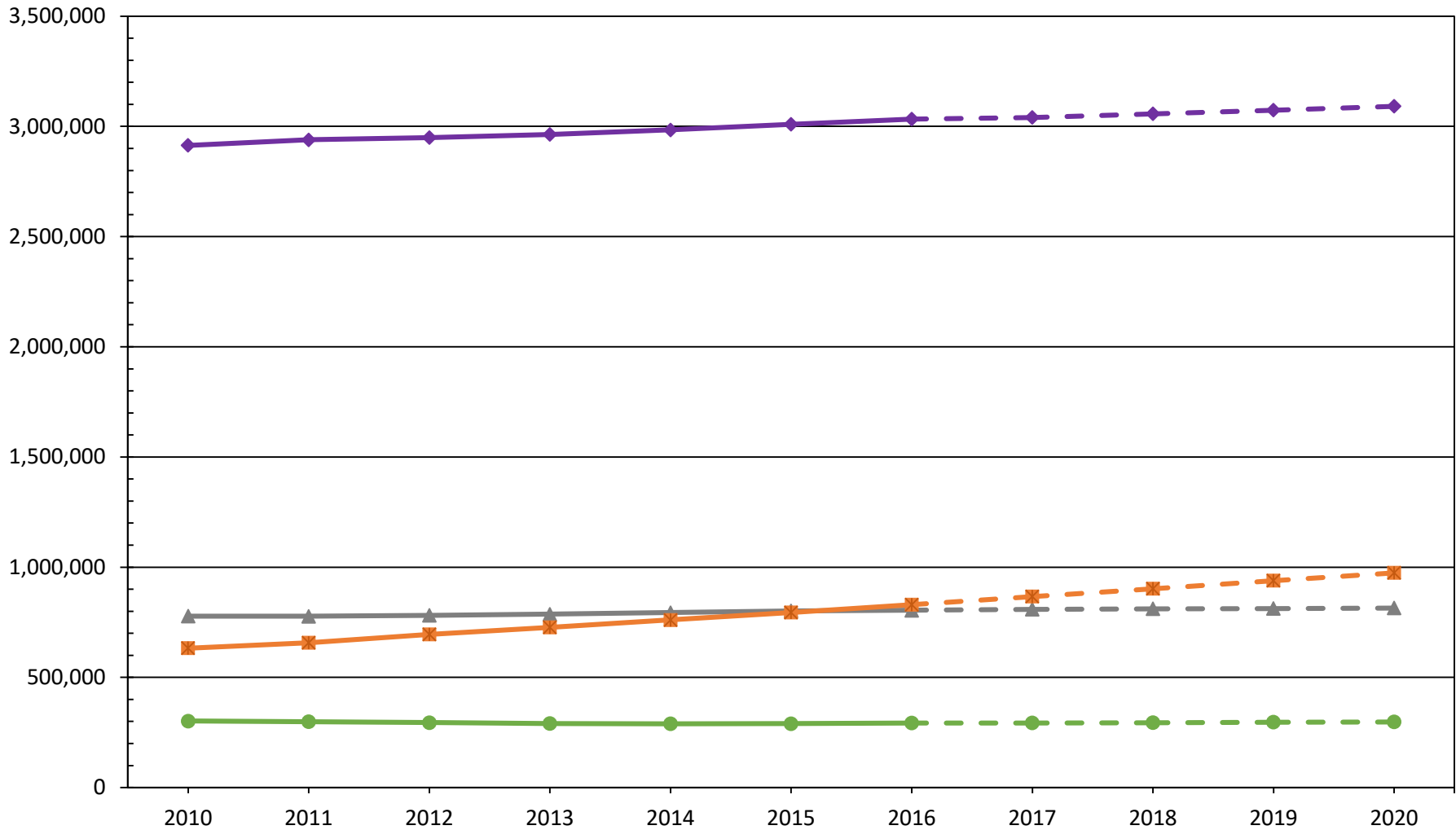

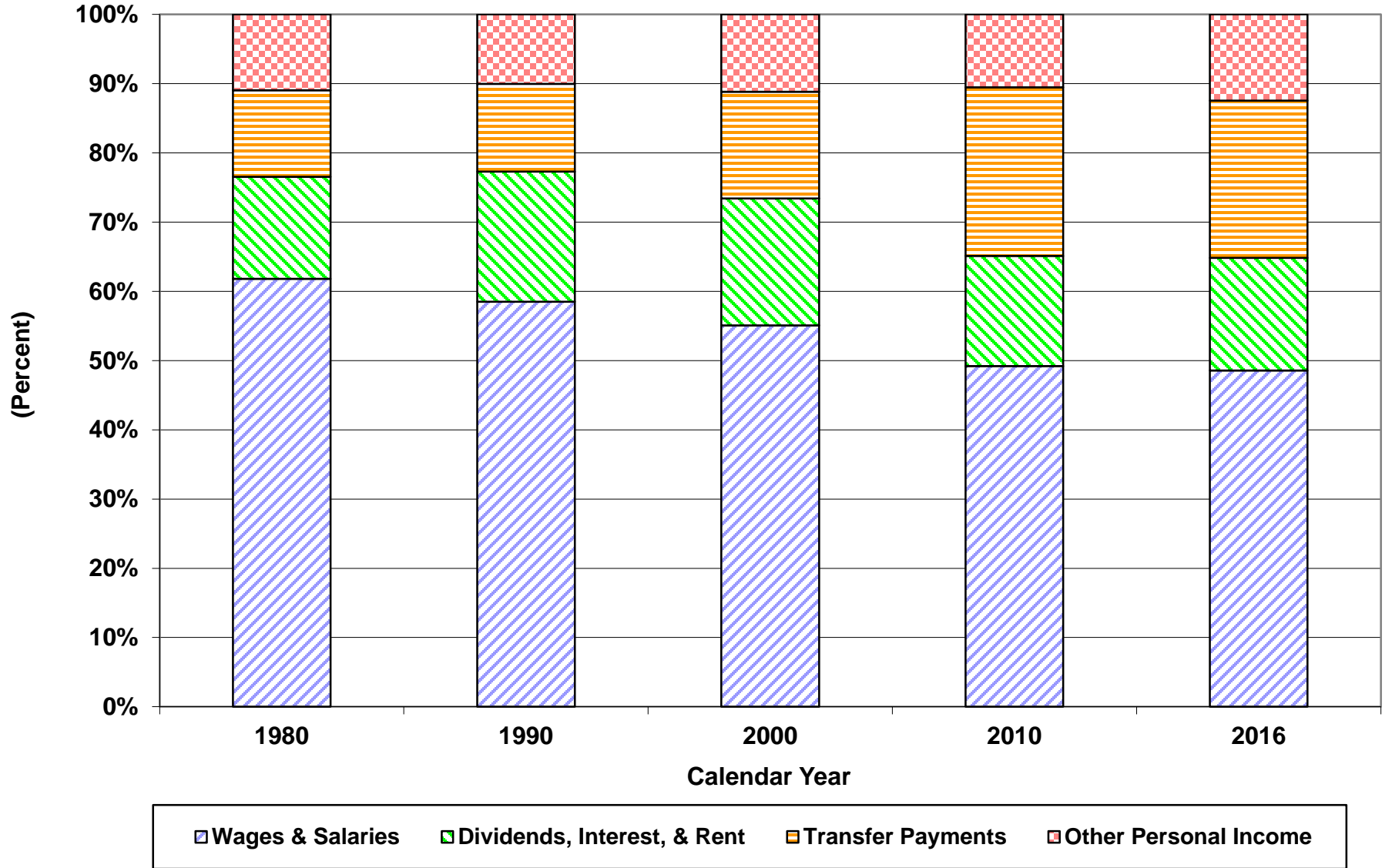
SOUTH CAROLINA POPULATION BY AGE GROUP 2010 TO 2020

 ✕ 65 Years and Older

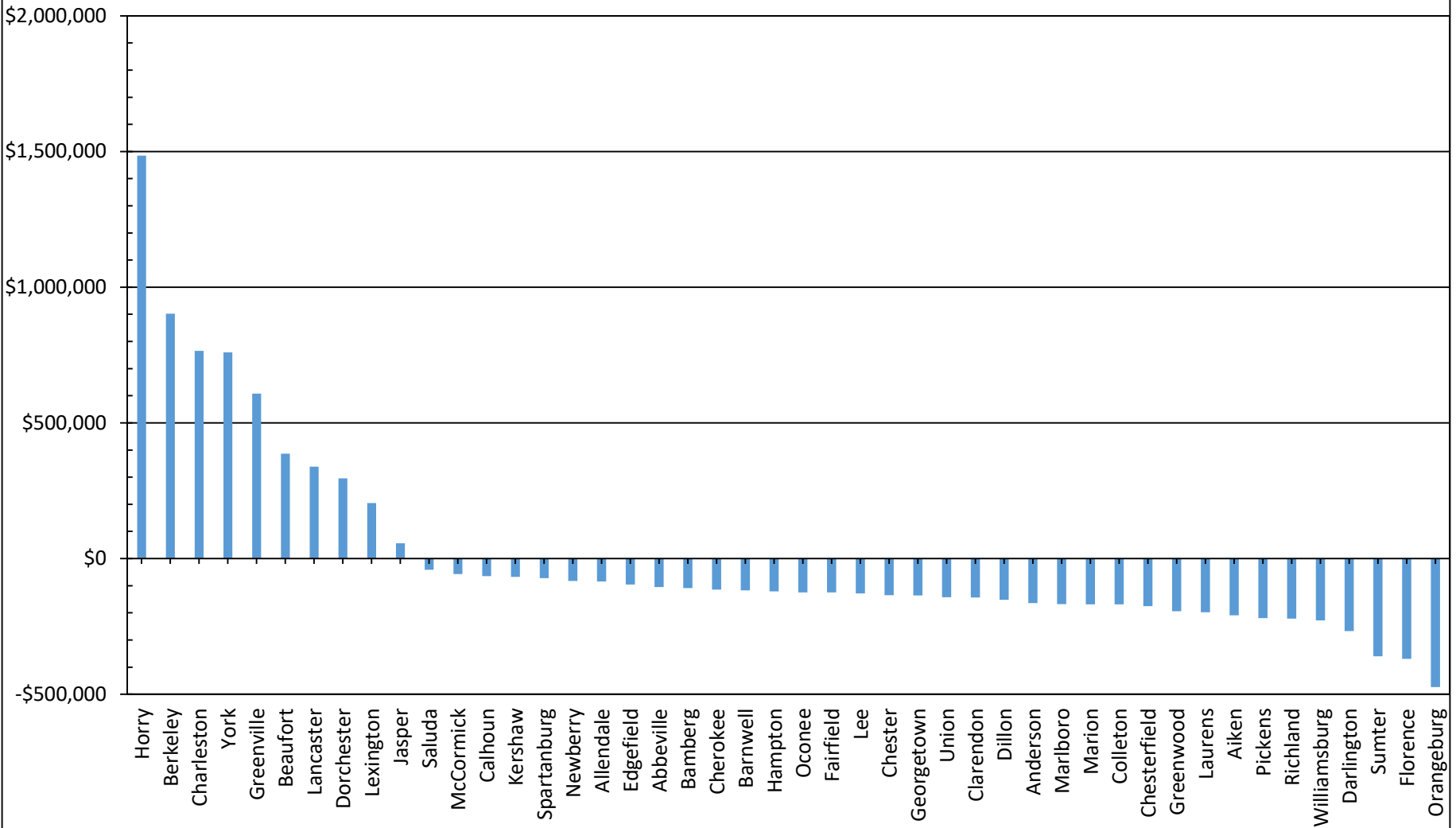

COUNTY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND CENSUS POPULATION IMPACT

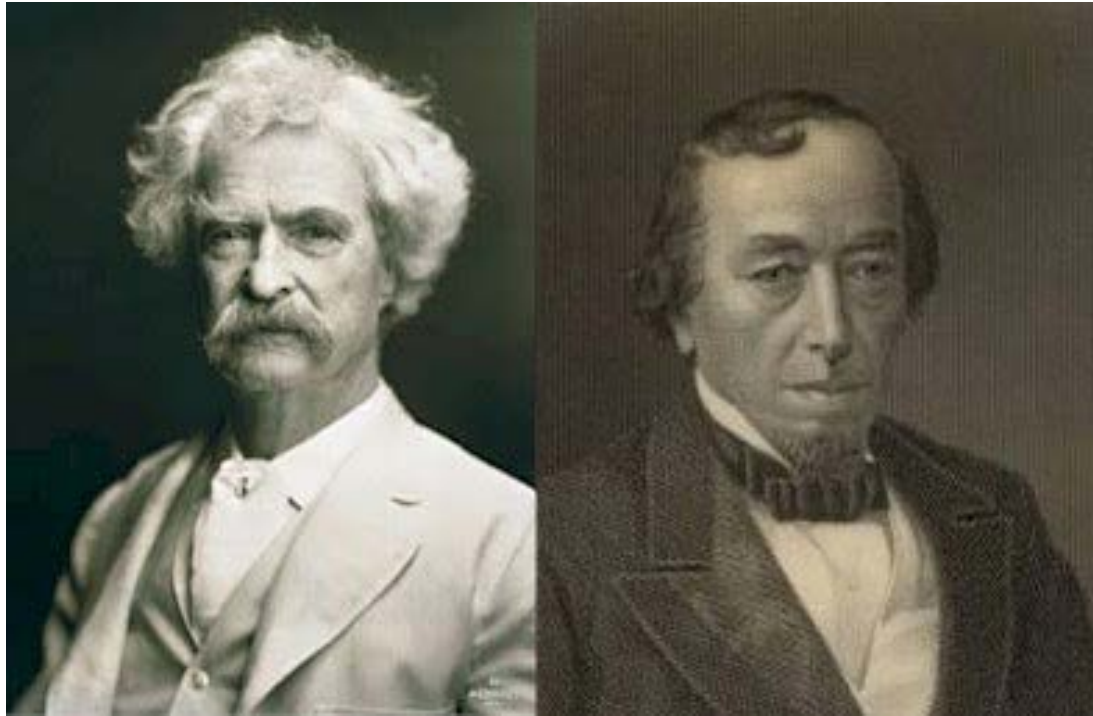
Funding With 2010 Census vs 2017 Estimated Population

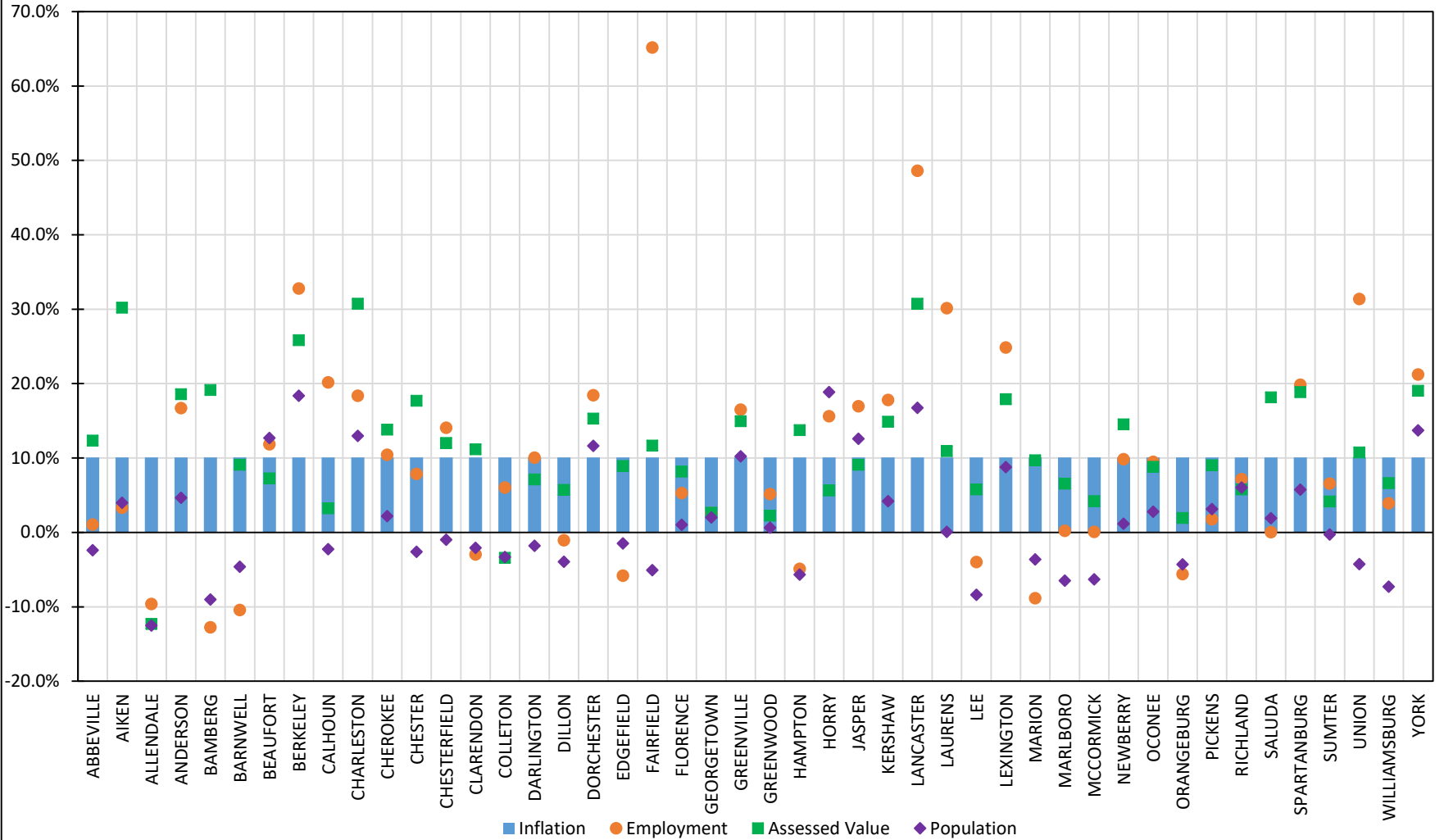

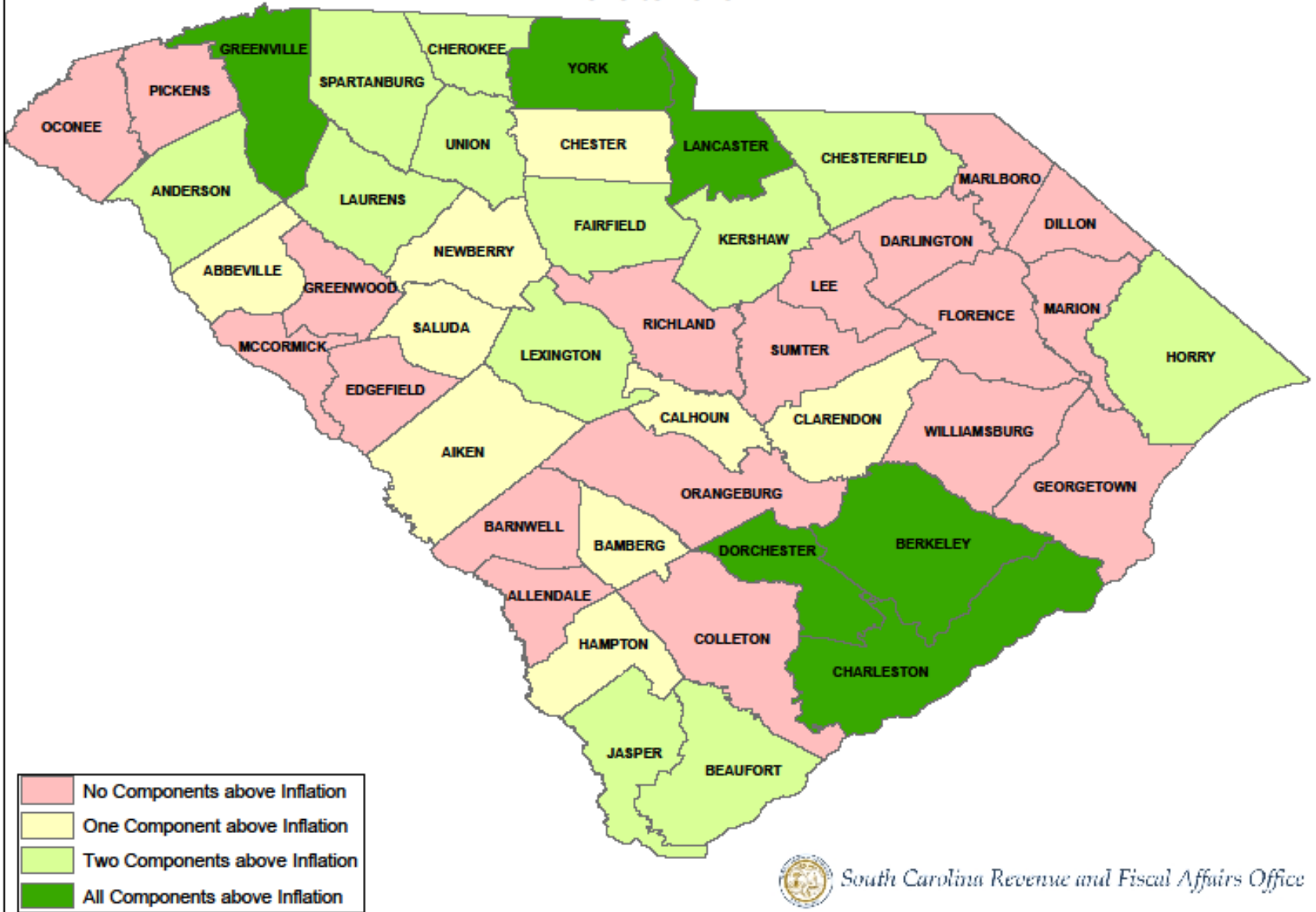
